Swaachh Bharat Mission (Gramin) - Maharashtra

Introduction:

Government of India launched the Total Sanitation Campaign for Rural sanitation in the year 2003-04. This triggered a social movement on sanitation in rural masses and helped improve their life style. The Campaign was re-named as Nirmal Bharat Abhiyan (NBA) from 01st April 2012. The campaign emphasised more on construction and use of Individual House Hold Latrine (IHHL). Under NBA, the incentive for the construction of IHHL was raised from Rs.3200 to Rs.4600. All BPL families and six categories of APL families viz. SC, ST, Small & Marginal farmers, landless families, physically handicapped and Women headed families were covered under NBA.

Recently from 02nd October 2014, Nirmal Bharat Abhiyan(NBA) is retitled as “Swachh Bharat Mission”(Gramin). The incentive for construction of IHHL under SBM (G) is raised from Rs. 4600/- to Rs.12000/- (GoI Share - Rs.9000/- and GoM Share – Rs.3000) for the categories mentioned above.

As per the guidelines under NBA the Base Line Survey (BLS) was conducted in the State of Maharashtra in all 27902 GPs during the period 02/10/2012 to 31/01/2013.

Planning for IHHL:

Detailed micro planning is done right from State through Division, District, Block, GP, Beneficiary levels in the State.

Year-wise, Region-wise micro-planning for making State ODF:

- **Konkan Division:** 300 toilets/day
- **Nashik Division:** 934 toilets/day
- **Amravati Division:** 693 toilets/day
- **Aurangabad Division:** 1150 toilets/day
- **Nagpur Division:** 420 toilets/day
- **Pune Division:** 505 toilets/day

New Concept of ODF introduced:

“ODF” is termination of faecal-oral transmission, defined by,

- a) No visible faeces found in the environment/village; and
- b) Every house hold as well as public community institutions using safe technology option for disposal of faeces

Gram Sabhas held during 25 September to 2 October 2015:

Initiatives of WSSD:

- Swachh Bharat Mission (Gramin) is launched nation-wide by the Hon. Prime Minister of India on 02nd October 2014
- A pledge was taken by all concerned and at all levels (State, Region, District, Block, GP) across the State of Maharashtra on 2nd October 2014
- Ministry of Drinking Water & Sanitation (MoDWS) has issued revised guidelines for “Swachh Bharat Mission (Gramin)” on 18/12/2014. Marathi translation provided to all Districts.
- Planning of completion of Individual House Hold Latrine (IHHL) construction along with other important components by 02nd October 2019 to make the State Open Defecation Free done
- Water Supply & Sanitation Department, Government of Maharashtra has taken various innovative initiatives for achieving these ambitious goals:
 - WSSO formed at State Level, DWSM at District Levels in all ZillaParishads and BRC at Block Levels across the State. The BRC is a dedicated army of consultants at Block Levels working for sanitation.

- Circular on Open Defecation Elimination Plan (ODEP) issued on 13/01/2015. It is made mandatory for the GPs to prepare Open Defecation Elimination Plan (ODEP) before execution.
- Government Resolution on empanelment of 22 Key Resource Centres (KRCs) at State Level issued on 01/09/2014 & Circular on empanelment of 83 Key Resource Centres (KRCs) at District Level issued on 01/09/2014. This extended arm of NGOs is made active for ODF+ status of the State.
- Government Resolution on Corporate Social responsibility (CSR) issued on 19/11/2014. The idea is to attract the corporate in water and sanitation sectors, and even bring the data on board of their routine works in these fields as well
- State Level & District Level Inter Personal Contact (IPC) Contact Plans are ready. Door to door visits are on to persuade the communities for the construction of IHHLs
- Off-Line Close Monitoring System involving maintaining registers at District, Block & GP Level started. The Reporting Formats for Village, GP, Block, District & Division are developed. The outcome would be Monthly Progress Reports & achievement based Ranking for healthy competition
- Circular on Supply Chain Management is being issued shortly for strengthening the supply chain required for speedy achievements tuned to time line suggested in SBM (G)
- Districts and KRCs involved in implementation would appoint Nirmal Doots in all AIP – GPS to develop local support in motivating the community, monitoring the progress and sustainability of systems
- Eols invited for empanelment of Manufactures, Installers for construction of Individual House Hold Latrines (IHHLs) and Community Sanitary Complexes (CSCs) along with Technology Providers (TPs). The scrutiny of proposals received is under progress
- Dedicated Deputy CEOs (Water & Sanitation) are appointed in ZillaParishads with the consent of RDD. This has increased the progress many-fold
- Photos of IHHL are being uploaded on IMIS of MoDWS, GoI regularly with geo-stamping (Longitude, Latitude, Altitude).
- Conglomerate of the Department, Line Departments and UNICEF is being achieved from time to time
- A demonstration Sanitation Park is erected in Bhokardan (District Jalna) with the help of UNICEF for communities to have actual feel of options available. This is being scaled up at all the Blocks across the State.....
